

It would be inappropriate to say that I loved this book in the normal sense. It was a very harrowing subject, based on things which happened in real life to real people, and it was incredibly well told. It is a book that will stay with me for ever, and I recommend it to anyone who is interested in historical facts. The story was well researched and extremely well written. How anyone can award a single star and criticise the writing, beggars belief. Certainly they have not lived in France or taken any time to get to grips with what happened here, to normal people, during the first half of the 20th Century, and the impact it has had on families today who find it impossible to reconcile differences or to forget the past; and for good reasons which need to be explained.

I liked the book very much although too much detail was given to Isabelle's torture following her capture, which was gruesomely detailed both physically, mentally and spiritually. The relationship between Isabelle and Gaetan could have been more developed. Both sister were portrayed as Hero's in their characters which honored each other.
