

I recently stumbled upon this book quite by accident, since I had long ago given up the notion of ever finding a book about the paranormal in France (Years ago, my French-born and raised grandmother told me that her people did not believe in ghosts). I especially like the way he compiled the book as if it were a travel journal, allowing us to "follow" him on his journey through haunted France.I would recommend this book for anyone interested in French history or the paranormal. It would make a wonderful gift for anyone planning a trip to France, especially those who are interested in the history of several historic sites and chateaux, and the ghosts that inhabit them.My only negative, and it's not really much of a negative, is that I would have preferred a few more details about Mr. Marsden's reactions and encounters with ghosts. This book was just too short.
