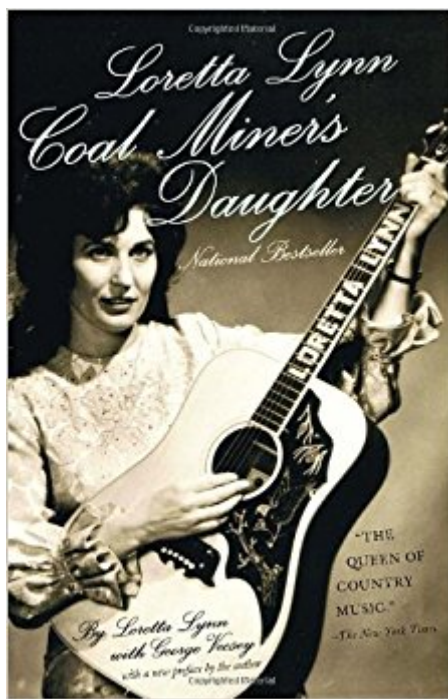


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# Loretta Lynn: Coal Miner's Daughter

This is a very touching book, you can't put down once you begin to read it. The life-long story of Loretta Lynn is powerful and breath-taking. The words in this book are not fancy, but candid, convincing and colorful, it is the true life of Loretta Lynn that wins the heart of millions of people. How poor is being poor? What is the struggle to escape from being poor? How Loretta Lynn became a country music diva from a coal miner's daughter? From this book, we share the life of Loretta Lynn with our own, we see the souls and dreams as well as day to day lives of many ordinary people, especially the human being under poverty. Loretta Lynn was born into a very poor coal miner's family in a remote Kentucky hillside. Her father had little money to feed Loretta and her family, one Christmas, her Daddy had only thirty-six cents (!) for Loretta and her three brothers. The work was very hard for her Daddy, he had to crawl on his hands and knees to work inside the realm of coal, of

only three feet high. Until seven years old, Loretta always wore flour sack her mummy sewed as dress. However, with her unyielding spirit and unceasingly struggling, Loretta went on and up, became the queen of country music and a millionaire. I didn't know the name of Loretta Lynn until I watched the movie "coal miner's daughter", this movie led me to this book. The movie is fantastic, but this book let you know more and think more. Either you like county music or not, either you are poor or rich, this book is absolutely good, inspiring, touching and unforgettable.

Her life has been hard, and she doesn't take any of her success for granted. She is who she is. What you see is what you get with her. A grandmother at 28? Wow! I learned a lot of interesting things about 1) the country music star, and 2) about coming up hard and making it work out. This book is Loretta Lynn's tale of her childhood in Butcher Holler with her poor but proud parents. Her parents allow her to be married off to a man she barely knows when she is 13. Amazingly, she remains married to this man for the rest of his life. Anyway, the husband encourages Loretta to sing publicly because he thinks she has a great voice. And I don't need to tell you how the career goes, because that's pretty popular knowledge. All in all, this was a great book. Very well developed and informative, whether you're a country music fan or not.

I have always loved Loretta Lynn, but could never find her autobiography. Finally I discovered a copy at the library where my sister works downtown and asked her to pick it up for me. I read it quickly, in just a matter of hours, and I love her even more now! Most people know the bare bones of her story, but told through her own unique voice, this book is really a treasure.
