

If you are seriously interested in architecture then this should be a staple of your library. Whether an architectural student or a professional this book is a must. It is well written in the text and superbly highlighted with examples of photographs and sketches. As a student in architectural school this was a valuable tool for studies and design ideas for projects. As a professional I would be lying if I said that I never pull it off my bookshelf. This is not a book for simple or light reading. It is a reference book that belongs in any architectural interested person's library.

I had an earlier version of this when I went to college - the new version has corrected the errors in the old version and added a LOT of photos and information. The original drawings are still used and they are phenomenal.

I bought Sir Banister Fletcher's a History of Architecture 15 years ago when I could finally afford my own copy. This is one of the best books to own if you are a student of architecture. If you can't afford it, just keep booking it out at your library. During my studies, it was in such demand that we
